

**ACUTE CORONARY SYNDROME:** ACS is a syndrome (set of signs and symptoms) due to decreased flow in the coronary arteries such that part of the heart muscle is unable to function properly or dies.

If you did NOT have a stent placed but antiplatelet therapy is prescribed **DO NOT stop** these medications before talking with your cardiologist.

## YELLOW ZONE - CAUTION - CALL YOUR PHYSICIAN IF YOU HAVE:

- Chest pain, pressure or tightness or return of symptoms which brought you to the hospital.
- · Shortness of breath
- Lightheadedness or dizziness
- Any adverse symptoms from your medications

## **RED ZONE - CALL 911**

**SEVERE** pressure, squeezing discomfort of pain in the chest, neck jaw, shoulder, arms or back, lasting more than 5 minutes OR NOT relieved after nitroglycerin. You can take nitroglycerin every 5 minutes for a maximum of 3 times.

- ♥ Severe Shortness of breath.
- ♥ Dizziness or passing out episodes.
- ▼ Nausea, vomiting, sweating.
- ♥ Chest pain while resting, or if awoken from sleep, lasting for more than 30 minutes call 911.
